Dear Parents/Carers,

Happy St. David's day! After the recent heavy rain and winds, let's hope that March brings with it better weather. When it is particularly wet and windy, we do allow our students to enter the building earlier than usual. Staff supervise them in the Auditorium and Dining Room before the bell sounds for morning registration. For Safeguarding reasons, students are only allowed in the building before 8.40 if they are part of our Breakfast Club, which is supervised by our support staff.

I announced last week that we were losing two of our long-standing members of staff as they move on to pastures new. Another member of the teaching staff – Mr Brown (Art teacher) is sadly also leaving us at the end of the academic year. Mr Brown has been with Christ the King since the amalgamation of the two middle schools back in 2012, and is one of our longest-serving members of staff, having been a teacher at ABK for many years also. Mr Brown has held many positions over the years as Head of Department, Head of Year, and several other posts. I am sure many of you will know and remember Mr Brown – as students and as parents – and I am sure you will join me in wishing him well in his new career. He will be a great loss to our school community.

A message from our Young Enterprise team Millie, Mollie, Bill and Rylee (Year 10 & 11 students)... there will be a Mothering Sunday workshop next Wednesday for our Year 7 students. This will take place at lunchtime. The £5 cost for this workshop enables students to design and create a t-shirt or tote bag with fabric paint provided. This is a House competition and the winner will receive a bag of sweets; it will be judged by teachers. This is to help our new business of screen printing. We have limited places available, and will be speaking to all Year 7s in their Assembly on Monday about this.

I would like to draw your attention to two issues which are on-going concerns nationally – the use of mobile 'phones and vaping.

Mobile 'phones

As you are aware, we have clear expectations and sanctions associated with mobile devices. The reasons for a ban on using mobiles in schools are well-documented; fundamentally, they distract students from learning, and they are the root cause of some anti-social behaviour which causes harm and upset to others. Our students are overwhelmingly compliant in adhering to our rules and expectations - we do not have a major issue in this respect. When we do have to apply a sanction, however, I would ask for your support in reiterating the reason for the policy and for students to accept our decisions.

Vaping

Along with a recent Government announcement about banning disposable vapes, here at school we are working hard to educate our young people about the dangers of vaping. The dangers of vaping and smoking are covered in our 'Living Well' curriculum, and early next

week, we will be focusing on the dangers of vaping in Assemblies and Form Time. Vapes are on our 'banned substances' in school, and as such we have a zero-tolerance approach to any students who bring vapes into school and/or use them, with serious sanctions in place for non-adherence. There is a useful guide for parents on the dangers of vaping here.

Finally, as well as having many students who represent our community so positively on almost a daily basis, we also have staff who carry the Christ the King flag. One prime example is Mandy Holloway, who was recognised for her 35 years' service to scouting on the Island at a service at Westminster Abbey earlier this week. Well done Mrs Holloway!



I leave you with a prayer linking the work St. David did to the wonderful work our NHS does on a daily basis, often in the face of adversity in terms of finances and staffing.
