National Crime Agency - Stop Invoice Fraud

The National Crime Agency and Department for Education have launched a campaign to raise awareness of invoice fraud in the education sector, urging teachers and education staff to spot the signs.



Invoice Fraud is a crime that costs schools millions each year and is one of the most common and costly forms of financial crime. It occurs when criminals deceive individuals and businesses into paying fake invoices, or diverting a genuine payment into accounts controlled by fraudsters. Fraudsters can impersonate suppliers, intercept emails or send convincing invoices to generate immediate payments into their own accounts. The aim is to manipulate victims into transferring funds to the fraudsters instead of their legitimate destination.
