# A-Level Music and Music Tech



- You can choose your own units, so tailor the course to what you want to get out of it.

## Course Structure



**The full course (Subsidiary Diploma) requires 90 credits, which is usually 7 units over 2 years. These can be in the areas of performing, music technology or composing, most students do a mixture. The half course (Extended Certificate) is 3 units over 2 years and can be taken alongside 3 A levels for an extra qualification and valuable extra UCAS points.**
